Sunday, November 29th, 2020 1st Sunday of Advent

As we begin the season of Advent, we hear Jesus exhort the disciples to watch as they wait by using a parable of the master of a house who leaves on a journey of indeterminate length. During that time, what will the servants

In the first reading, Isaiah gives us a rather bleak picture of what happens over time when the people of God live by their own devices. Isaiah's plea for reconciliation reminds us that the God of Israel is the only God, no matter where or when the people have sought other gods. They find themselves in the emptiness of their disobedience, far from God's saving mercy.

We are God's people, waiting and watching. Advent is our time of journeying towards love and a reminder that our human nature is flawed. Devotion to gods of our own making will keep us separated from Jesus. In the second reading, Paul boldly reminds us what our hope is: "You are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will strengthen you to the end...God is faithful; by him you were called into fellowship with his San. Jesus Christ our Lord."

Watch, then, that we journey every moment with Jesus Christ our Lord.

Reopening Planning Committee Update: IMPORTANT CHANGES

NEW - GOVERNMENT OF ONTARIO FRAMEWORK FOR HEALTH MEASURES- The Government of Ontario has a new framework for the description of COVID-19 health precautions. The Health Unit in each area will determine the level of risk and accordingly, the health precautions to be put in place. The Framework has five levels: Green – prevent, Yellow – protect, Orange – restrict, Red – control and Lockdown. It is the authority and responsibility of the local Health Unit to determine and monitor the stage for their regional jurisdiction.

Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit serving St. James and St. Anne's has moved to ORANGE LEVEL effective Monday, November 23, 2020, at 12:01 a.m.

Parishes will continue to restrict attendance at all liturgical celebrations Or by mail: 82 Joseph Street, PO Box 32, MacTier, ON POC 1H0 to 30% capacity. Indoor meetings are restricted to 50 people maxi-

HEALTH PRECAUTIONS IN OUR PARISHES

- Safely determine 1/3 capacity of a church
- Sanitize and be vigilant about the hygiene practices at the church
- Post signage for the wearing of face masks, entrances, exits, use of hand sanitizers, etc.
- Establish distinct doorways for entering and exiting.
- Make the Diocesan announcement before the weekend Masses during the pandemic.
- REVISED Follow safe health precautions for singing at Masses.
- Instruct parishioners about clear procedures for the distribution of Holy Communion
- Face masks are now required in places of worship and work sites in the province of Ontario. Make sure signage is posted, priest is wearing the mask when he is not speaking/singing, the parishioners are verbally reminded to wear mask and have a supply of face masks on hand in case parishioners have forgotten to bring a face mask. (Those who have a medical exemption from wearing the face mask are to be respected and welcomed.)

PARISH BULLETINS & OFFERTORY ENVELOPES:

Parishes may prepare paper parish bulletins effective immediately and plan a touchless way to make parish bulletins available to parishioners. Similarly, for the distribution of offertory envelopes, parishes will do so in a manner that avoids touching and the gathering of people around a table.

SUNDAY MISSALS AND MISSALETTES:

Parishes can order missals and/or missalettes for parishioners and plan a touchless way to deliver the missals/missalettes. If the parish orders missals/ missalettes, follow the same guidelines as noted above for parish bulletins and offertory envelopes. Advise parishioners that paper items left in the church during the pandemic will be collected and put in the recycle bin.

SALE OF GOODS AT THE PARISHES:

Please do not host or hold events for the purpose of selling items such as but not limited to Christmas cards, calendars, Holy Land items, etc. Any such items not essential to the operation of our parishes should not be sold at
